**CHARLES M. HALL AND
FRANK F. JEWETT**

Charles M. Hall and Frank F. Jewett, inventors of the telephone, lived in this house from 1875 to 1877. It was here that they conceived and developed their invention, which revolutionized communication. The house was built by the architect William B. Tappan and is a fine example of the Queen Anne style. It is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.
